Communist China

Can the Leopard Change its Spots?

Is the “New Economic Policy” really new?

In 1920, shortly after the Russian Revolution, Lenin instituted what he called the “New Economic Policy”. He saw it as a temporary embrace of limited capitalism to save the Communist takeover of Russia. When the premature collectivization of agriculture resulted in the country’s starvation:

This allowed the small farmer class, the kulaks, to sell their excess product in the open market.

Doctrine Marxist-Leninists charged Lenin with forsaking the Communist revolution and some even committed suicide.

Lenin said they did not understand the dialectic. That you approach your objective by taking one large step forward and two small steps backward. Example: only a fool, when he sees someone take a hammer back while hammering a nail, believes that he has no intention of bringing it down again with even greater force. Lenin also said, “The capitalists in their greed will sell us the hemp to make the rope to hang them.”

Today, modern China proudly proclaims that they are true Marxist-Leninist Communists dedicated to World Communism. They proudly proclaim that they are following in Lenin’s footsteps... his “New Economic Policy”. This is what allows them to use limited capitalism to build their program of world Communism.

The United States and other multi-international capitalist corporations in their greed for cheap “slave” labor, are selling out their country’s labor force and transferring their manufacturing “know how” and plants to China in the mistaken notion that this is a “free lunch”.

Inside the Chinese Communist Mind

It is good to remember that a communist Chinese totalitarian regime that can make an accommodation with capitalism to help build their regimes as long as it suits their purpose can also terminate their accommodation when it suits their purpose. How many remember the nationalization and “take-over” of all

foreign investments in Cuba, nationalization of American Oil Companies by the Marxist regime in Mexico in 1938, the “take-over” of the foreign oil companies in the Mid-East and just now the nationalization and “take-over” of American companies by the Communist dictator of Venezuela.

One of the brightest minds on world Communism is Dr. Fred Schwarz. In his 1996 book, “Beating the Unbeatable Foe”, he states that every doctor knows that conditions which exist at present, won’t necessarily remain the same in the future. He states that the probable future is called “the prognosis”.

The following are some examples from the fascinating book:

“When considering Communism in China, it is vitally important to consider the prognosis. Today, capitalism prevails in the economic realm, while Communist dictatorship retains political power. What will the future be?”

“One favorite Communist saying is ‘the only constant is change’ and it is important to discover what changes the Communist leadership may have in mind. A unique opportunity for insight into the Chinese Communist mind is provided by recent discussions between the highest level of Chinese Communist leaders and the first official Republican Party delegation led by American Ambassador, Faith Whittlesey. These discussions took place in the great hall of China from April 2 to May 14, 1994. Dr. Clark Bowers was a member of the U.S. delegation and the following is a record of some of the questions she asked MoXiusong, Vice Chairman of the Chinese People’s Political Consultative Conference and the answers:

Clark: Is the long-term goal of the Communist Party of China still world Communism?

Mr. Mo: Yes, of course, that is the reason we exist.

Clark: Is it possible to reach your goal of world Communism while any of the bourgeois or their economic environment still exist?

Mr. Mo: No, that would be against the laws of science.

Clark: As part of your reform, do you even desire to ever allow for anti-socialist political parties?

Mr. Mo: No, that would be unconstitutional.

Mr. Mo: We believe that in the past we overemphasized the form of the relationship of productions within society. Lenin's New Economic Policy has much to offer in this regard.

Atheism if the First Scientific Law

Mr. Mo: If one chooses to join the party, they must understand and believe in the scientific laws of Socialism. The first of these scientific laws is atheism.”

All of the above is pure Leninism.

“The prospect that the Chinese Communists, in the foreseeable future, will possess massive military and economic might is alarming. Anyone who thinks that the current capitalism practice by Communist China will change Communism to an eventual democratic state doesn't understand the power of the Communist Party. Mao stated all power comes out of the barrel of a gun. Everyone in China is disarmed except the Red Army. Anyone found possessing a firearm is subject to immediate execution. The Tienamin Massacre is a good example. Plus China has over one thousand “Laogai” gulag labor camps. James Mann, a principled China Watcher, in his new book (his third on China) states that most China Watchers are in bed with the Chinese regime and its American business partners. “They ceaselessly propagandize the ‘China Fantasy,’” the idea that the successful spread of capitalism in China will gradually result in the development of democratic institution, free elections, an independent judiciary after a respect for human rights. After 30 years of economic reform in China, every major dissident is either in prison, or in exile.”

The Communist Chinese have learned that many areas of freedom are unthreatening to the monopoly of political power. But the Party also believes it has learned from Tianamen that democratization is not an irresistible force. China is using the profit fueled from it's “New Economic Policy” with the U.S. and the West to bankroll the largest military build-up in history. The Wall Street Journal, July 15, 2005, “General Chenghu, a dean at China's National Defense University, speaking in the context of conflict between Beijing and Taiwan, China would make a nuclear first strike on America. He also declared that China would be prepared to absorb the destruction of most of its cities in a nuclear exchange that would wipe out hundreds of American cities.” Napoleon Bonaparte said, “China? There lies a sleeping giant. Let him sleep! For when he wakes, he will move the world.”

The United States must stop fueling this aggressive giant by encouraging our manufacturing base to move to China by promoting so-called “Free Trade” instead of “Fair Trade.”
